
Critical Guidelines driving this plan:




Current Dallas City Council District Map made in 2011

Notice how district numbers bump into each other, are near other district lines, and are even inside other districts in this 2011 map.



Notice how district numbers are much more evenly spread out in a map designed for compactness. Districtr is powerful!




The community a City Council Representative lives in must not be distant from the communities they claim to represent.







Why only section 11 below, Kessler Park, was selected to be part of District 2




Quintanilla Middle School, in 14 above, is as of 3/16/22 still 94% Hispanic. Gentrification is a slow process.







District 10 area in 14 parts

A more detailed study in the effort to make District 10 the strongest Black plurality district possible.



By moving parts 2 & 8 back into District 10, and other small changes, District 10 becomes a 78.1% Minority district with a 17.8 percentage point Black advantage over the White-non-Hispanic percentage before forming a Minority Coalition.
