By way of introduction, I am a director of the Exchange Club of Lake Highlands. ECLH is a service organization that serves the Lake Highlands community. The Club was formed in 1960 and has served primarily to support schools in the Lake Highlands High School feeder pattern (Richardson ISD located within the City of Dallas). Each year, we raised and give back at least \$100,000, typically much more, to fund scholarships for high school seniors from LHHS, along with meeting funding shortfalls and improvements in area schools that neither RISD nor the PTAs could fulfill.

We feel strongly that District 10 of the City of Dallas should remain as close to the current boundaries as possible to maintain the compactness and to preserve the communities of interest that exist. District 10 enjoys a very positive balance of diversity not only in the area of race but also in religion, economics. The district has the advantage of a small town feel in a very large city. Breaking Lake Highlands and Hamilton Park in different council districts would have a very negative impact to our little section of Dallas.

According to the census data released by the city, District 10 is not drastically out of balance from the ideal of 93,169. As such, we support the COD-017 map submission by Commissioners Bryant, Stimpson and Lopez. This map will reduce the deviation to less than 4% vs the current deviation of just over 5%.

District 10 does not need a major overhaul; please do not carve up the current District 10.

Good Morning,

I attended and spoke at the District 12 Redistricting Town Hall held at the Timberglen Recreation Center on February 12, 2022. First of all, I consider it a privilege to be part of this important process. Following my 3-minute talk, several Redistricting Commissioners asked that I create a map of how I think District 12 should be drawn under 2022 redistricting goals.

I think the most important element of my presentation centered around relationships between the different political elements that make up Far Northwest Dallas. To refresh your memory, Far Northwest Dallas residents live in Collin or Denton County. The children who attend public schools in Far Northwest Dallas are in the Plano or Farmers Branch-Carrollton school district. All those of us who live in Far Northwest Dallas are represented by the Collin County or Denton County DA. None of the residents of Far Northwest Dallas live in Dallas County or attend Dallas County Schools.

Therefore, it is imperative that the Dallas City Councilperson who represents Far Northwest Dallas be very familiar with and live near Collin and Denton County in order to understand the unique challenges of our area and to develop, build and maintain relationships with those elected officials that must work together to best represent the residents of Far Northwest Dallas.

After considering population density and diversity, I feel that the City Council person representing this area should be zoned to live north of Arapaho Road.

I created several redistricting maps for your consideration.

Map 1 (Community Map): Far Northwest Dallas to Campbell Road https://districtr.org/COI/124404

Map 1 is a community recommendation for all Dallas residents who live west of Campbell Road and north of the imaginary boundary along Trinity Mills Road. As I mentioned in my discussion on February 12, the area represented in this community map is both dense and diverse. 55,000 residents live within the boundaries of this community map and the minority representation is high for Far North Dallas.

Map 2 represents my community recommendation for all residents of the City of Dallas who live west of Preston Road and north of the imaginary boundary along Trinity Mills Road. There are two very large Homeowners Associations that should not be broken up by redistricting, so I added this area to my Map 1 recommendation.
